â€™Mahagonnyâ€™™ at LAOpera

Rise and Fall of the City of Mahagonny; a new production by the Los Angeles Opera; Music by Kurt Weill " Text by Bertolt Brecht; English translation by Michael Feingold by Rodney Punt

It would appear to be the perfect morality tale for our time. The Kurt Weill-Bertolt Brecht collaboration, Rise and Fall of the City of Mahagonny, proffers a story of the unlicensed pursuit of sex and money, and in the process deconstructs a libertarian dystopia with more than a passing resemblance to todayâ€™™s America.

Written during the Weimar Republicâ€™™s death-rattle, it reflects the years of pervasive decadence in a Germany reeling after the First World War and vulnerable to the reactionary â€™œmoralityâ€™• of an ascendant Nazi fascism. Three years after the workâ€™™s sensational premiere in Leipzig in 1930, Adolph Hitler would become Chancellor of Germany and begin the heinous imposition of a new political order.

The plot of Mahagonny chronicles the rise of an unbridled town founded by crooks, one of whom is an amoral brothel madam, Leocadia Begpick (Patti LuPone). Dedicated to pleasure and license, the town attracts sharks from everywhere who exploit it, including prostitute Jenny Smith (Audra McDonald). A chump from Alaska named Jimmy McIntyre (Anthony Dean Griffey) lands with cash in hand and in search of pleasure. Begpick offers him his pick of the girls, and he chooses Jenny, who will do anything to satisfy him. The rest of the thin storyline chronicles Mahagonnyâ€™™s rise and Jimmyâ€™™s fall.

I would like to report the much heralded new production of Mahagonny by the LA Opera, premiered Saturday evening at the Chandler Pavilion, makes a case for the viability of the work in our time. But while given a lavish outing with good intentions, the work will appeal more to champions of 20th Century German angst than general audiences, for reasons only partially under the control of its current producers.

As conceived here, Mahagonny looks dazzling, a Las Vegas-like fun city all lit up in Technicolor. Mark Baileyâ€™™s set effectively depicts the growth of Mahagonny from its initial desert emptiness into a megawatt symphony of neon with suspended buildings and signs that collect, or descend, as the city grows.

Mahagonny is peopled, however, with glitzy-ditzy cartoon characters moved around like props who, when they speak, mostly remind us sin ainâ€™™t good. Hampering some of the potential for action was the relatively static if efficient staging of John Doyle. Flickers of life do emerge in the din of depraved humanity from Doyleâ€™™s ensemble scenes, and shtick from a colorful cast comically festooned in costumes designed by Ann Hould-Ward.

Patti LuPone brings a starâ€™™s rÃ©sumÃ© to the huffing and puffing role of madam Begpick, her famous voice somewhat diminished by a weak upper register. The doomed Jimmy is delivered by Griffey in a generous and pliant tenor, but with a stage a presence limited by his characterâ€™™s one-dimensional didacticism. The eveningâ€™™s stand-out, vocally and with a real stage charisma, is the sensuous Jenny of bright-voiced, beguiling Audra McDonald.

James Conlon's direction of the musical forces, like everything he has done so far for the LA Opera, sets musical standards way up in the stratosphere. Musical Los Angeles continues to lead a charmed life with this latest addition to our resident conductors.

The acidic bite of the original Weill-Brecht collaboration, a sensation in its own time and place, has lost more than a few teeth for general audiences today. It's riddled with problematic qualities: a theatrical convention of distancing the action in favor of agit-prop sermonizing, a musical score rich in eclectic inventiveness but with vocal lines so devoted to similar cynical utterances they can tend toward monotony, and a storyline that has lost its metaphorical shock appeal for 21st century audiences.

Concerning the latter, the "sins" of personal license in Mahagonny's working class protagonists " drinking, whoring, and gambling - seem as quaint and naive as those of a "Western as contrasted with our own era's horrors: terrorism at home and abroad, cooked national intelligence leading to dubious wars, exploitative corporate profiteering and, well, you get the picture.

Musical theater (or if you prefer, opera) that employs characters primarily as props for political point-making is hard to bring to life. One recalls Leonard Bernstein's Candide, full of musical sparkle and verbal repartee, but ultimately a clever bore. Mahagonny aims higher, but registers in a similar way. The decision to amplify the mixture of musical theater and operatic voices further compromises theatrical presence from characters on stage that need a human existence separate from their message.

Mahagonny's creators are a legendary duo. Bertolt Brecht remains an icon to the intellectual Left who revere his political criticisms of the evils of capitalism, and appreciate his unique poetical skills in the German language. Kurt Weill has had a revival in recent decades among cognoscenti bent on keeping alive the Central European avant-garde musical tradition, developed in the years before Nazism either killed off or scattered its creators to distant shores, most famously our own in Los Angeles.

LA Opera is promoting something of a revival of notable musical creators of the 1930's with this production of Mahagonny and next month's companion program, Recovered Voices, featuring works by other composers suppressed by the Third Reich. Credit Conlon for this innovative visit to a fast receding musical history.

While Mahagonny has not worn well, it does represent an important historic contribution to an elevated musical theater style and its relationship to an era of social upheaval and moral stress. It echoes in our time. For that reason alone Mahagonny, and next month's Recovered Voices program, are well worth our attention.
